A Christmas Message From The Rectory

I do hope everyone is enjoying seeing the Church as it used to be seen from the road some 30 or more years ago. A big THANK YOU to the parish councillors and others who formed a merry band to clear the bank in front of the church so that it can once again be clearly seen from the road. Roots need clearing before it can be planted, but this will all be happening in due course – perhaps not in time for Spring bulbs this year but certainly for next.

Our plans to create a warm and welcoming space in the South Transept have not gone as smoothly. Opposition from the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB) have seriously delayed the Faculty process (which is the church equivalent of gaining planning permission, and just as slow). The Chancellor of the Diocese (with whom the decision will rest) came to Poynings in October, to hear the objections and our case. We think he was broadly sympathetic but we have been asked to show in writing that we have fully considered other options. Watch this space...the work continues.

We are looking outwards as well as at our own plans this December, with an appeal for goods needed by the local charity Off the Fence, who support some of the most vulnerable people, who lack shelter and other basics at this time of year. There are boxes in each of our churches for your donations, and lists of what is needed.

Since the last newsletter, we have a new Warden and new Treasurer – thank you. If anyone is interested in the very part time (but paid: £10 an hour for about 2 hours a week) post of administrator, please get in touch, and I will be happy to let you know what is involved.

Meanwhile, chilly pantomime rehearsals are in full swing, as are plans for our Christmas services. It would be lovely to welcome you to our Carol service on 17^{th} December; the Christingle on 24^{th} , or at Poynings on Christmas morning on the 25^{th} at 10am. There is a full list of times and dates elsewhere in this newsletter and on the church and village websites.

However you celebrate, I hope Christmas is a special time for you, and that you can take time to stop and give thanks for all that it means to you.

The current situation is that the wood owner has yet to comply with the orders made against him and we are waiting for the result of an appeal. He has tried to sell the land without success as the enforcement orders would pass to any new owner. The SDNPA are acting on the legal advice they have taken and are sending out weekly reports to the Parish Council. Our Clerk, Colin, updates the village website with appropriate information. You may have noticed that the Poynings roundabout has been cleared and is ready for re-planting. The roundabout layout has been designed by and is being maintained by villagers, Adam and Jess of Green Lotus Gardens, based at Dyke Farm Barn. We have applied for further funding to improve areas in the village that are subject to flooding and we are carrying out work to maintain the village in good order. Amber is to provide a bench in memory of our former councillor, Jake Richards. We will install it on Cora's Walk. The Cutress family also plan to provide a bench in memory of Margaret who did so much for the village during her life. You will have noticed the trees and shrubs that obscured the church have been cleared with the assistance of locals and the Lee family. This is ongoing work and the bank will now be improved with assistance from the Parish Council. Mike
