2017 was another successful year for Poynings CC for both senior & junior cricket. Our first XI finished 4th in a highly competitive Division 1 whilst our 2nd XI finished 6th in their first ever season in Division 5. The creation of our 2nd XI has given opportunities to many of our junior players, as well as our new recruits from the village! The main highlights of the season were our Development XI winning the Stoner Mid Sussex Conference for 2nd season running & the inaugural game with Poynings CC & Poynings Village which attracted over 100 people to the ground on a Friday night. This game was organised by many volunteers from the club & village in an attempt to raise the awareness of our thriving club which has clearly worked. Our junior teams continue to grow, this summer we ran 5 age groups from U10-U14 giving opportunities to over 60 players. Our stand out teams were our U11 & U13 teams who both narrowly missed out on 1st place in their respective leagues. A lot of these players have now represented our adult teams by playing in either the 1st XI, 2nd XI or Development XI & are now considered the future of the club. At the end of the season we rewarded 4 of our junior players by nominating them for Sussex Junior Trials. I am pleased to report that 3 made it through to a 9 week pre-xmas training programme. We are all thoroughly excited for 2018 across the whole club & we will keep the village posted with our fixtures & events that take place. Bob Powell

Bob and Betty Powell moved to Poynings in 1950 and Bob first became involved in village life when Tony Cutress asked him to lend a hand with the scout troupe. Bob soon got stuck in and especially enjoyed the annual camp where he would ghoulishly demonstrate to the boys how to kill and skin a rabbit! He later started up a village youth club in the old village hall and to raise funds built go-carts in the front room of 21 Mill Close which he would then take to

school and village fetes charging the patrons half a crown a ride (no health and safety in those days). Some of the local boys wanted a football team but the cricket field was not suitable so Bob quickly found a way to obtain the piece of ground on the opposite side of the road. It soon became apparent that changing facilities were required so Bob set about raising funds to build a pavilion and used the free services of local tradesmen at weekends and evenings to get the pavilion built and it still stands today and is in regular use. Alongside organising the football team Bob and Betty initiated a junior stoolball team with Bob umpiring and providing much of the transport and Betty scoring. From there they scored and umpired the adults very successful mixed stoolball team.

Bob was a man who could always fix things. If he hadn't got the tool or the aptitude to fix it himself, he knew someone who could. Bob was there for everyone.
